Requests for E-Consult and Telehealth Policy and Funding Support

The E-Consult Workgroup requests California stakeholder endorsement for letters we have drafted outlining needs for e-consult and telehealth funding and policy support. They include the following:

- [AB2164](#) creates the E-Consult Services and Telehealth Assistance Program within the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to award grants to health centers to implement and evaluate e-consult programs.
- The E-Consult Workgroup has drafted a [letter to the Office of Governor Gavin Newsom](#) outlining patient and provider needs for telehealth and requests your support.
- The E-Consult Workgroup has developed a [toolkit on policy considerations](#) for e-consult champions during the COVID-19 pandemic. This will be updated with new information and ideas as state and federal responses develop.

Pending CMS Approval of DHCS 1135 Waiver Affecting Billing for E-Consult

On March 16th, the [Department of Health Care Services \(DHCS\)](#) submitted a [Section 1135](#) waiver to seek flexibility in how it administers the Medi-Cal program. DHCS requested confirmation from CMS that all proposed flexibilities listed below apply to all Medi-Cal delivery systems, including Managed Care, County Mental Health Plans, COHS plans and Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery Systems (DMC-ODS).

- **Provider enrollment:** streamline enrollment through waiver of certain requirements, including in-state licensing requirements.
- **Provider credentialing:** eases MCO and PIHP requirements to complete the credentialing of providers
- **Alternative places of service for billing:** list includes mobile testing sites and temporary shelters such as commandeered hotels purchased by the state
- **Telehealth flexibility:** for all state plan benefits where medically appropriate
- **Waiver of FTF requirement for FQHCs and RHCs:** would implement AB 1494 (2019), including telephone
- **E-Consult for FQHCs and RHCs:** waives FTF requirements to allow FQHCs and RHCs to bill for e-consults for new or established patients

We will continue to monitor the approval and implementation of the 1135 waiver.

To address the COVID-19 pandemic, e-consult provider ConferMed is offering free access to critical resources for safety net providers. These resources include online access to Infectious Disease and public health specialists with triage procedures and protocols for fighting infections.

As ConferMED is offering this as a free service, they ask that submissions be limited to clinical questions about specific patients and that clinicians limit themselves to one consult until additional funding is secured to support this important effort.
